How to become an Oregon-Columbia Masons: Concrete Finisher Apprentice:

1. Register for Orientation at <u>nwcoc.com/register-here/</u> by clicking the red 'Register for Orientation' button.

<u>Week 1</u>

- 2. Attend the Orientation to learn about our apprenticeship program and decide if you want to move forward with a State of Oregon application.
 - a. Orientation starts at 7:30am. No late entry allowed.
 - b. Take a UA which includes testing for marijuana.
- 3. If you decide to apply for an apprenticeship program, gather and submit the required Minimum Qualification (MQ) documents.
 - a. Required MQ Documents:
 - 18 years of age (must provide proof of age)
 - b. Submit required MQ documents to <u>apply@nwcoc.com</u>.
- 4. Submit additional documentation for the Application Point System to get the highest possible ranking. Ranking determines where you are placed on the applicant list and how quickly you are dispatched to an employer. The Application points are optional, but the more points you accrue, the higher you will be placed on the Qualified Applicant List.
 - Example of documentation that can earn you points: a valid driver license, CDL, military, education, industry certifications, volunteer work, work keys, and recommendation letters on company letterhead that speak to work experience, performance, etc. (See full Application Point System below.)

<u>Week 2</u>

5. Attend jumpstart. This 2-day training start the Monday following the Orientation. (See schedule below.) Not all who attend Jumpstart are guaranteed entry into the apprenticeship program.

Helpful Information

- 1 Applicants without the ability to drive **and** without reliable transportation may have a difficult time in this program. Having the ability to drive will significantly increase your chances of finding and maintaining employment.
- 2 You can be drug tested at any time. Failing a drug test results in suspension from the program for 6 months.
- 3 Applicants who are available for travel within the Northwest are more likely to succeed in this industry than those who are not. Individuals available for work in a limited geographic area [Portland only or Vancouver only, for example] will find it more difficult to find and maintain employment.
- 4 Apprentices are required to attend classes as part of their program. If apprentices fail to attend their classes, which often take them away from work, they are canceled from the program and often terminated from employment.
