MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

• 18 years of age (must provide proof of age)

ALL APPLICANTS MUST ALSO:

- Complete a Trade Orientation (free of charge)
- Complete sponsor Construction Safety Training
- Complete sponsor Jump-Start (pre-construction) Training (free of charge)

NOTES:

- Employment opportunities are subject to economic conditions
- Selection will be based on an applicant ranking system
- Employers may require a valid driver's license and drug test
- VETERANS who have GI Benefits may use them in this program
- Graduates of a BOLI-approved Pre-Apprenticeship Program are encouraged to use this program

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA:

- Oregon Counties: Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington, Deschutes, Marion, Linn, Lane, Benton
- Washington Counties: Cowlitz, Clark, Wahkiakum, Klickitat, Skamania and Pacific

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING:

Approximately 6,000 hours of on-the-job training are required for completion of Bricklayer and Masonry Restoration apprenticeship.

Bricklayer and masonry restoration apprentices will learn to construct and remodel many types of structures, including: houses, commercial buildings, bridges, churches and factories. They lay building materials such as brick, structural tile, and concrete, cinder, glass, gypsum and terra cotta block to construct or repair walls, partitions, arches, sewers and other structures.

Bricklayer and masonry restoration work is physically demanding and involves a great deal of standing, climbing, kneeling, lifting and squatting. Working conditions will vary with each job. Work will be both indoors and outdoors, and could include working above or below ground. The location of the job site generally changes multiple times during the year, so bricklayer and masonry restoration apprentices may need to travel or relocate to maintain employment. They must also meet certain strength requirements, be agile, and have good hand-eye coordination.

RELATED TRAINING:

A minimum of 144 hours of classroom training is required each year to complete the program. Classes are held at Northwest College of Construction in Portland, OR.

WAGE SCHEDULE:

Apprentice wages are based upon the average wage for journey workers employed by participating training employers. The journey worker wage as of June 1, 2025 us \$42.60. Apprentices are paid a progressive percentage of that average journey wage as follows:

1st	1,000 hour period	50% of average wage
2 nd	1,000 hour period	60% of average wage
3rd	1,000 hour period	70% of average wage
4th	1,000 hour period	80% of average wage
5 th	1,000 hour period	90% of average wage
6 th	1,000 hour period	95% of average wage
