REGISTRATION IS CURRENTLY CLOSED

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- 18 years of age (must provide proof of age)

ALL APPLICANTS MUST ALSO:

- Complete a Trade Orientation (free of charge)
- Complete sponsor Construction Safety Training
- Complete sponsor Jump-Start (pre-construction) Training (free of charge)

NOTES:

- Employment opportunities are subject to economic conditions
- Selection will be based on an applicant ranking system
- Employers may require a valid driver's license and drug test
- VETERANS who have GI Benefits may use them in this program
- Graduates of a BOLI-approved Pre-Apprenticeship Program are encouraged to use this program

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA:

- All of Oregon and SW Washington

This program is registered with the Oregon State Apprenticeship & Training Council and is recognized by Washington State Apprenticeship and Training Council under the terms and conditions of the reciprocal agreement.

This program conforms to the Equal Employment Opportunity in Apprenticeship Plan, OAR 839-011-0200, minorities and women are strongly encouraged to apply.

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING:

Approximately 4,000 hours of On-the-Job Training are required to complete this program.

Laborers range from semi-skilled to highly skilled workers whose job duties might include working for highway contractors, utility contractors, building contractors, or specialty contractors. A laborer must know how to work with his/her hands and with power tools run by gasoline, electricity, and compressed air.

Laborer work is performed both indoors and outdoors and may be done at a surface environment, at extreme heights, underground, or above or under water. All laborers should expect to do a considerable amount of lifting thus strength, dexterity and alertness is required. As a supporter of other skilled craftsmen, laborers’ work requires that their skills be diversified. Laborers must have good math and reading skills to use today’s highly technical tools and equipment.

While most jobs are within a 50-mile radius of the Portland/Vancouver Metro Area there may be several jobs available throughout the state of Oregon and SW Washington. An apprentice is expected to have reliable transportation to get to the jobsite and school.

RELATED TRAINING:

A minimum of 144 hours of classroom training is required each year to complete the program. Classes are held at Northwest College of Construction in Portland, OR.

WAGE SCHEDULE:

Apprentice wages are based upon the average wage for journey workers employed by participating training employers. The journey worker wage as of June 1, 2026, is \$30.98. Apprentices are paid a progressive percentage of that average journey wage as follows:

1 st	1,000-hour period	65% of average wage
2 nd	1,000-hour period	70% of average wage
3 rd	1,000-hour period	80% of average wage
4 th	1,000-hour period	90% of average wage
